QUEBECERS MOST LIKELY CANADIANS TO HAVE DOWNLOADED THE COVID-19 ALERT FEDERAL APP AND MAJORITY FIND IT USEFUL

INTRODUCTION

At 42% Quebecers are the most likely in the country to have downloaded the federal government's COVID-19 exposure alert app according to a survey of 1522 Canadians conducted via web panel between November 13 and 15 by Leger Marketing in partnership with the Association for Canadian Studies. Some 7 in 10 Quebecers regard the app as useful. According to the survey, the vast majority of Canadians have not downloaded the application.

The results are paradoxical given the initial reluctance on the part of the Quebec government to encourage use of the federal Covid-19 tracing app concluding in August that the benefits of the technology were limited, and did not outweigh privacy concerns. Premier François Legault endorsed those findings and said the province wouldn't sign on to COVID Alert. He added that if the province were going to use an app, he would prefer it to have been developed in Quebec. But with the spike in cases and public health officials expressing growing concerns with the capacity of the province's health-care system to withstand the surge Quebec ultimately determined that it could no longer wait.

While no margin of error can be associated with a non-probability sample for comparative purposes, a probability sample of 1522 respondents would have a margin of error of ±2.5%.
