

ECONOMIC WELLBEING SCORECARD: QUEBECERS FEEL THEY'VE BEST WEATHERED THE ECONOMIC IMPACT OF COVID-19 ACROSS REGIONS OF CANADA AND THE UNITED STATES

METHODOLOGY

- 1524 Canadians and 1004 Americans 18 years of age or older, randomly recruited from LEO's online panel.
- Using data from the 2016 Census, results were weighted according to gender, age, mother tongue, region, education level and presence of children in the household in order to ensure a representative sample of the population.
- No margin of error can be associated with a non-probability sample (Web panel in this case). However for comparative purposes, a probability sample of 1524 respondents would have a margin of error of $\pm 2.52\%$, 19 times out of 20, while a probability sample of 1004 would have a margin of error of $\pm 3.08\%$, 19 times out of 20.
- The research results presented here are in full compliance with the CRIC Public Opinion Research Standards and Disclosure Requirements.
