INTRODUCTION

That which follows we provide insights into how genocide is understood by Canadians via a national opinion survey and focus specifically on the extent to which it is felt that the country's indigenous peoples have been the victims of genocide. To do so we focus on the following questions:

- I) In one sentence please tell us what you think about when you hear the word Genocide?
- 2) Indigenous peoples in Canada have been the victims of Genocide?
- 3) If you agree a Genocide took place what form did it take?
- 4) Who Canadians believe is responsible for injustices towards indigenous peoples?
- 5) Are you proud of Canada's history?



METHODOLOGY

The data were collected via a web survey conducted by Leger for the Association for Canadian Studies from June 7 to 11, 2019 among a representative sample of 1,560 English- or French-speaking Canadians, 18 years of age or older. An equivalent phone survey would have a margin of error of 3.5 points 19 times out of 20.

Using data from Statistics Canada, the results were weighted according to gender, age, region, language spoken at home, education and whether or not children are present in the household to ensure a sample representative of the entire population under review.
