INTRODUCTION: QUEBEC FRANCOPHONES SOMEWHAT MORE OPTIMISTIC THAN NON-FRANCOPHONES ABOUT TIME LINE FOR RETURNING TO 'NORMAL'

One in two Quebecers now think it will be two years before things return to something closer to life before COVID-19 (January 29-31, 2021) This contrasts with earlier projections when in mid December 2020 (prior to the holidays) when the vast majority of Quebecers seemed optimistic about 2021 owing to positive forecasts about the vaccine roll out. Yet earlier projections of a perceived return to relative normalcy by the middle of 2021 now seem less likely to correspond to the public's forecast. In July 2020 a majority of Quebecers thought a resumption of normal activities would occur in one year or less. It is worth noting that a January 15-17, 2021 survey found that 62% of Quebecers were "upset that you don't know when the COVID-19 crisis will end.". That figure was the highest for any region in Canada.

The data collected above are based on four surveys by Leger for the Association for Canadian Studies with the most recent survey of January 29-31, 2021 conducted with 1559 Canadians and while no margin of error can be associated with a non-probability sample, for comparative purposes the national sample would have a margin of error of $\pm 2.5\%$, 19 times out of 20.
