

**NEARLY ONE IN THREE CANADIANS DO NOT THINK THAT THE
VACCINE IS EFFECTIVE; SIX IN TEN WOULD TAKE A BOOSTER BUT
AN IMPORTANT MINORITY ARE BOOSTER HESITANT**

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INTRODUCTION:

CURRENT BELIEF IN VACCINE EFFECTIVENESS AND THE DEGREE OF BOOSTER HESITATION

Booster shots and third doses of COVID-19 vaccines aren't currently recommended for most Canadians and health experts and federal agencies continue debating their need across the general population maintaining that the primary vaccine still provides sufficient protection against COVID-19. Each province and territory has enacted a third-dose policy for immunocompromised people and more recently booster shots have been recommended for all long term care residents and seniors living in similar settings at least six months after the primary vaccine. Surveys have confirmed that the majority of Canadians are open to taking a booster shot. An October 8-10 Leger survey for the Association for Canadian Studies confirms majority desire for a booster. In this analysis we examine the reasons for resistance to booster shots, but also look at the extent to which Canadians continue to believe in the effectiveness of the vaccine and establish the current level of what we'll call booster hesitation. Some 1545 Canadians were surveyed via web panel between October 8th and 10th, 2021 and while no margin of error can be associated with a non-probability sample for comparative purposes, a probability sample of 1537 respondents would have a margin of error of $\pm 2.52\%$, 19 times out of 20

Three in ten Canadians currently do not believe the vaccine is effective in preventing them from getting the virus
