Join a discussion about the interplay of community issues and social factors that affect immigrant youth. The lived experiences of gang-involved youth shows that negative interactions within families, schools and communities can result in disempowerment, a corresponding under-developed Canadian identity, and a lack of empowering ethnic identity. There is a corresponding school of thought concerned with marginalization and criminalization of ethnoracial youth. Others focus on radicalization. These views invite dialogue on the underlying factors related to criminal involvement, as well as implications for policies, services and practice related to ethnoracial youth.
